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Q-1. What is sentence?

Ans: A sentence is a group of words that makes complete sense.

- A sentence always begins with a capital letter.
- A sentence usually has a full stop [.] at the end.
- If a sentence asks a question, it ends with a question mark [?].

Examples:-

- (i) Dharmish is a famous singer.
- (ii) The school was closed.
- (iii) Tannu was born in Mumbai.
- (iv) Delhi is a big city.
- (v) Do you know swimming?
- (vi) What games do you play?

The Sentence



Read the following groups of words.

- ❖ The came soon teacher.

- ❖ The birds worked all day long.
- ❖ Plants need soil, air, water and sunlight to grow.



Out of the four groups of words given above, only the last two groups make complete sense. Hence, only the last two groups of words are sentences.

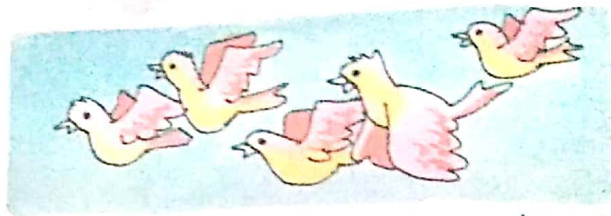

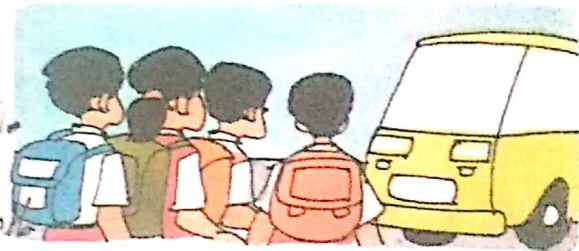

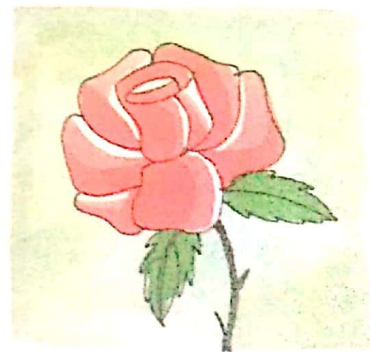
