## Sentences: Their Kinds

The first and the fourth sentences are saying or stating something. They are called assertive or declarative sentences or statements. Such sentences end with a full stop. The second sentence expresses a sudden feeling of pleasant surprise. It is an exclamatory sentence. An exclamatory sentence ends with an exclamation mark. The third sentence asks a question. So it is an interrogative sentence. An interrogative sentence ends with a question mark. The fifth sentence expresses a command. It is an imperative sentence. An imperative sentence also ends with a full stop.



A sentence that states something = Declarative or assertive sentence or

- A sentence that asks a question = Interrogative sentence or question
- A sentence that expresses a sudden feeling = Exclamatory sentence
  - A sentence that expresses a command, a request or advice
    - = Imperative sentence.
